AUTHORIZED DISPOSAL FACILITIES FOR STORM DEBRIS IN CLINTON AND ESSEX COUNTIES

GENERAL

Storm debris consisting of wood material, such as logs, stumps and brush, can generally be disposed of at three types of facilities: (1) exempt sites; (2) registered facilities; (3) permitted facilities. This type of debris is referred to as land clearing debris or "LCD" (see definition below). Construction and demolition ("C&D") debris resulting from construction, repair or demolition of structures can only be disposed of at a permitted facility. EXEMPT SITES

A landfill for the disposal of trees, stumps and wood chips generated from these materials is exempt when origin and disposal of such waste occur on properties under the same ownership or control [6 NYCRR Part 360-7.1(b)(1)(ii)]. This means that a municipality could collect LCD-type storm debris from highways and highway right-of-ways owned or controlled by those municipalities, and dispose of that material on other property owned by the municipality. Storm debris generated from privately owned property could not be disposed at these sites.

REGISTERED FACILITIES

Landfills three acres or less in size that accept only LCD material are eligible for registration. Registering a new LCD site entails submitting a one-page registration form with a location map for validation by the Department. Certain operational and closure conditions apply. A registration form for new land clearing debris landfills is attached. All currently registered LCD sites in Essex and Clinton Counties are listed below. The facility operator should be contacted prior to hauling any waste to a facility, since acceptance of waste is at the discretion of the operator. DEFINITIONS

<u>Land Clearing Debris (LCD)</u>: vegetative matter, soil and rock resulting from activities such as land clearing and grubbing, utility line maintenance or seasonal or storm-related cleanup such as trees, stumps, brush and leaves and including wood chips generated from these materials. Land clearing debris does not include yard waste which has been collected at the curbside.

*land clearing debris does not include lumber, plywood, treated wood, painted wood, etc.

Construction and Demolition (C&D) Debris: uncontaminated solid waste resulting from the construction, remodeling, repair and demolition of utilities, structures and roads; and uncontaminated solid waste resulting from land clearing. Such waste includes, but is not limited to bricks, concrete and other masonry materials, soil, rock, wood (including painted, treated and coated wood and wood products), land clearing debris, wall coverings, plaster, drywall, plumbing fixtures, nonasbestos insulation, roofing shingles and other roof coverings, asphaltic pavement, glass, plastics that are not sealed in a manner that conceals other wastes, empty buckets ten gallons or less in size and having no more than one inch of residue remaining on the bottom, electrical wiring and components containing no hazardous liquids, and pipe and metals that are incidental to any of the above.

Solid waste that is not C&D debris (even if resulting from the construction, remodeling, repair and demolition of utilities, structures and roads and land clearing) includes, but is not limited to asbestos waste, garbage, corrugated container board, electrical fixtures containing hazardous liquids such as fluorescent light ballasts or transformers, fluorescent lights, carpeting, furniture, appliances, tires, drums, containers greater than ten gallons in size, any containers having more than one inch of residue remaining on the bottom and fuel tanks. Specifically excluded from the definition of construction and demolition debris is solid waste (including what otherwise would be construction and demolition debris) resulting from any processing technique, other than that employed at a department-approved C&D debris processing facility, that renders individual waste components unrecognizable, such as pulverizing or shredding.
