PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: The work involves responsibility for physical therapy casework in a program designed to meet the needs of residents referred to the program. The incumbent assists with evaluating, planning and providing physical therapy treatment to residents in accordance with a referral from a physician or other health provider. The work is performed under the general supervision of a higher level administrator, physician or program coordinator. The incumbent does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: (Illustrative only)

- Performs physical therapy procedures in accordance with the written directions or referrals from a physician or other health care provider;
- Performs initial screening, evaluation and consultation for residents referred to the program; Develops goals, treatment objectives and therapeutic activities and tasks to be incorporated
- into the resident's individualized treatment plan; Maintains written case notes and other written documentation as required by State laws or local regulations:
- Records evaluations, reevaluations, progress notes, consultations and treatment summaries in resident's file;
- Attends and participates in staff conferences on residents' needs and progress;
- Meets with physicians and other staff to coordinate physical therapy treatment, reviews resident progress and adjust goals and activities as necessary;
- Assists in the development of physical therapy policies, procedures, priorities, caseloads, and assessment tools;
- Establishes and maintains communications and a rapport with physicians, therapists and other health care providers.
- Makes routine maintenance checks on wheelchairs and other equipment and when necessary arranges for their repair.

<u>FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES, AND PERSONAL</u> <u>CHARACTERISTICS</u>:

Good knowledge of the principles, techniques, and practices of physical therapy; good knowledge of the operation and maintenance of apparatus and equipment used in physical therapy; good knowledge of pathological conditions and socio-economic factors affecting a patient's disabilities; working knowledge of community resources applicable to physical therapy; ability to plan and supervise the work of others; ability to get along well with others.
